Spring in Hanoi begins with the Lunar New Year (Tet Holiday) and lingers until April, bringing a gentle charm to the city. The season paints Hanoi in soft hues - the pink of Nhat Tan peach blossoms, the white of bauhinia flowers, and the tender green of new leaves on ancient trees. The season's soul lies in the cool, moist air and the fine drizzles that cast a soft, misty veil over the Old Quarter. Immersing yourself in the city's culinary delights, you can taste spring in the lingering flavors of Tet - banh chung, pickled onions, and pork sausage - or in the steam rising from a bowl of bun thang or hot pho enjoyed at a sidewalk stall. The lively spirit of the season fills the streets of Hang Ma and Hang Dao, while in the outskirts, the rhythm of village festival drums mingles with streams of people enjoying their first festive outings of the year.

STROLLING AMIDST HANOI'S SPRING BLOSSOMS

The essence of a Hanoi spring is also captured in the brilliant spectacle of countless flowers blooming in unison. As Tet arrives, the city transforms into a vibrant floral canvas, painted by its many fields, gardens, and markets. To lose yourself in a sea of blossoms, breathe in the clean, natural fragrance, or capture photos against a dazzling floral carpet are unforgettable experiences that a Hanoi spring offers.



FLOWER MARKETS

Hang Luoc Tet Flower Market: Held just once a year, this market is dedicated to peach blossoms, apricot blossoms, narcissus, and traditional Tet decorations.

THE SEASON OF TRADITIONAL FESTIVALS

For over a thousand years, since King Ly Cong Uan decreed the capital's move, the land of Dai La has transformed from an agricultural village into Hanoi, the Capital of Vietnam. Here, vibrant city streets have risen from ancient village foundations, yet they remain encircled by a belt of historic villages that continue to preserve their timeless ways of life. This profound village culture is deeply embedded in Hanoi's identity, its spirit is alive in the city's communal houses, pagodas, and traditional festivals. To follow the joyful crowds to a spring festival is to journey back in time, to connect with the very soul of the northern villages right in the heart of the bustling capital.

As soon as Tet ends, the exhilarating sound of festival drums resounds throughout Hanoi. Within the city center, ancient traditions are treasured as living memories of old Thang Long. The Dong Da Mound Festival (on the 5th day of the 1st lunar month) erupts in celebration of the glorious victory at Ngoc Hoi - Dong Da. In the heart of the Old Quarter, festivals at Bach Ma Temple and Kim Ngan Communal House honor the guardian deities and patron saints of the ancient guilds. The Phu Tay Ho Festival (on the 3rd day of the 3rd lunar month) is an occasion for offering incense to Mother Goddess Lieu Hanh and praying for prosperity and good fortune.

Venture into the suburbs, and the festive energy becomes even more vibrant, rich with the authentic character of the northern delta. The Huong Pagoda Festival in Huong Son Commune (from the 6th day of the 1st lunar month to the end of the 3rd) is Vietnam's longest, an epic pilgrimage that blends sightseeing with spiritual devotion amidst a breathtaking landscape. The Co Loa Festival in Dong Anh Commune (5th-6th day of the 1st lunar month) brings the legend of King An

Duong Vuong and the magic crossbow to life within the walls of his mythical citadel. Some festivals are celebrated across multiple locations, showcasing a powerful sense of community. The Giong Festival, held in Soc Son Commune (6th-8th day of the 1st lunar month) and Phu Dong Commune (7th-9th day of the 4th lunar month), is recognized by UNESCO as an Intangible Heritage of Humanity. The Hai Ba Trung (Trung Sisters) Festival is eagerly celebrated at three different temples dedicated to the heroines: in Me Linh Commune (6th day of the 1st lunar month), in the Hai Ba Trung Ward (4th-7th day of the 2nd lunar month), and in Hat Mon Commune (6th day of the 3rd lunar month).

Touch the Soul of Silk, Folk Art, and Bamboo Craft Villages

VAN PHUC SILK VILLAGE

Ha Dong Wd., Hanoi

The journey begins in Van Phuc, a village on the Nhue River with a silk-weaving tradition stretching back over a thousand years. Its exquisite silks were once reserved for the royal court and are now known in the fashion capitals of Europe. Stroll beneath the colorful umbrella-lined path, visit weaving workshops, and choose a piece of fabric that suits your taste.





PAINTINGS AND PHOTOGRAPHY VILLAGES

The next stop is Kim Hoang Folk Painting Village (Son Dong Commune), once one of the major villages of folk painting in Northern Vietnam. Traditionally made for Tet, Kim Hoang paintings are known for their vibrant red or pink paper and lively, refined details. You can speak with the artisans, learn the history of the craft, try printing a picture yourself, and purchase a finished piece.

Not far from Kim Hoang Painting Village lies the "Photography Village" of Lai Xa, known as the birthplace of Vietnamese photography. The Lai Xa Photography Museum tells the fascinating story of the village's photographic heritage.

PHU VINH RATTAN AND BAMBOO WEAVING VILLAGE

Phu Vinh Hamlet, Phu Nghia Commune

 land of rattan", it produces a wide range
 of items, from everyday goods to furniture
 and decorative pieces. Visit the workshops,
 watch the artisans' intricate work, try some
 simple weaving yourself, and find beautiful,
 handcrafted items to take home.



Less than 10km from Phu Vinh, visitors can stop by Tram Gian Pagoda - an 800-year-old temple famed for its exquisite wooden architecture and hundreds of precious Buddha statues. The pagoda's Spring Festival (held from the 4th to 6th day of the 1st lunar month) features traditional activities such as the Saint Palanquin Parade and folk games.

This tour celebrates the remarkable skill of Hanoi's artisans, taking you to Quat Dong Embroidery Village, Trach Xa Ao Dai Village, and Ha Thai Lacquerware Village to witness the singular essence of these ancient crafts.



TRACH XA VILLAGE

Continue to Trach Xa, a thousand-year-old village that preserves the art of tailoring the traditional Vietnamese ao dai. Here, you can have a custom ao dai made, then wear it for photos against the village's timeless backdrop.



HA THAI LACQUERWARE VILLAGE

Hong Van Commune

The journey continues to Ha Thai, a village with a centuries-old history of creating gilded lacquerware for the royal court. Here, you can admire exquisite finished pieces, listen as artisans explain this unique Vietnamese art form, and even participate in a small step of the process - like applying lacquer or inlaying eggshells - to appreciate the meticulous patience each piece requires.

Just a few minutes from Ha Thai Lacquerware Village lies Dai Lo Temple (also known as Lo Temple) in Hong Van Commune - a sacred site dedicated to the Four Holy Mothers. The Lo Festival (held from the 1st to the 10th day of the 2nd lunar month) fills the area with the vibrant spirit and colors of traditional spring festivities.



Summer in Hanoi has a beauty of its own; though the days can be sultry, the air is filled with the passionate energy of youth. To truly connect with the season, rise with the sun and join the morning exercise groups that gather by Hoan Kiem Lake. Midday is for wandering through tree-lined streets, seeking refuge in one of the city's countless and unique themed cafes. As evening approaches, cycle around West Lake to watch the sunset as the sky transforms into a painted masterpiece.

The irresistible allure of a Hanoi summer is also found in its cuisine. The hot weather is the perfect excuse for the city's cooling dishes to take center stage. There's bun cha, with its fragrant, charcoal-grilled pork served with fresh herbs, and the light, clean broth of *bun oc* (snail noodle soup) that helps dispel the heat. Fresh pho rolls and fresh

spring rolls are also light and delicious summer options. But it is the drinks that are truly the "soul" of a Hanoi summer.

A cup of lotus seed or black bean sweet soup served with soft grass jelly, a glass of iced dracontomelon juice with its perfect sweet-and-sour balance, or a cold draft beer enjoyed with boiled peanuts - that's how you taste the true flavor of Hanoi.



CHECK-IN WITH HANOI'S LOTUS SEASON

Summer is when a kaleidoscope of flowers takes over Hanoi. The capital seems to don a rainbow cloak, with streets painted purple by giant crepe-myrtle blossoms and schoolyards set ablaze by the red of poinciana flowers. And, of course, there is the iconic pink of lotus buds rising from vast green ponds. May and June, when the sun is at its most intense, are precisely when the city's lotus ponds burst into fragrant bloom, offering an opportunity to experience a special side of Hanoi's beauty.

West Lake has long been famous for its immense lotus ponds, which create a brilliant pink-purple spectacle in the summer. You can hire a boat to glide among the blossoms for your own photos or have your photos taken by one of the professional photography services available on-site. The Quang Ba lotus pond (Tay

Ho Wd.), located near Au Co Street, offers a serene atmosphere, ideal for quiet contemplation amidst the lotus fragrance. For those wishing to combine their sightseeing with a temple visit, the pond at Tay Ho Temple is a perfect choice.

If your travels don't take you to West Lake, other beautiful ponds await, including Vinh Ninh (Dai Thanh Commune) in the southern suburbs, Thach Ban (Long Bien Wd.), which retains a rustic countryside feel, and Phuong Trach (Vinh Thanh Commune), conveniently located for a visit to the nearby ancient citadel of Co Loa.



A GREEN RETREAT IN THE LAND OF XU DOAI

When the city's poinciana and crepe-myrtle trees burst into bloom under the summer sun, it serves as an open invitation to escape the urban pace and seek solace in the verdant, tranquil land of Xu Doai.

The Xu Doai region stretches from the Day River to the Tich River and the Da River, bordered by the Red River to the north and the Ba Vi mountain range to the southwest. This area is rich with famous historical sites, including the Son Tay Ancient Citadel (Son Tay Wd.) and the "Four Great Pagodas of Xu Doai": Thay Pagoda (Quoc Oai Commune), Tram Gian Pagoda (Chuong My Wd.), Tram Pagoda (Chuong My Wd.), and Tay Phuong Pagodas (Tay Phuong Commune).



Thay When visiting Pagoda, don't miss "Tinh Hoa Bac Bo", a spectacular open-air performance staged on the lake at the mountain's base. It uses a blend of sound light, and water effects to bring the culture and beliefs of the Red River Delta to life.

DUONG LAM VILLAGE

Son Tay Wd.

A quintessential destination in Xu Doai is Duong Lam Ancient Village, a place where time seems to stand still. Known as the "land of two kings" for being the birthplace of national heroes Phung Hung and Ngo Quyen, the village is architecturally unique for its widespread use of laterite stone in walls, gates, wells, and even paving. Its centuries-old houses, with their laterite walls, red-tiled roofs, and ironwood columns, remain steadfast against the passage of time.

UNMISSABLE CHECK-IN SPOTS IN DUONG LAM:

The Village Gate: Dating back to 1833, the gate stands beside a banyan tree over 300 years old, creating a scene of profound peace and nostalgia.

Mong Phu Communal House: Built in the style of a stilt house with gracefully curved roofs, the communal house features exquisite carvings typical of the Le Trung Hung period.

Mia Pagoda: Home to nearly 400 Buddhist statues, the pagoda is a masterpiece of Vietnamese Buddhist architecture.

EAT & STAY

The cuisine here is a highlight, featuring rustic yet flavorful dishes like Phu Nhi steamed rice cakes, Mia chicken, and fermented soybean paste made on site. The most famous specialty is Duong Lam roasted pork, made by rolling pork belly in a bamboo tube and slow-roasting it over charcoal for hours. This results in incredibly crispy, golden-brown skin and tender meat, infused with the rich flavors of honey and five-spice powder.

Located about 60km from the center of Hanoi, Ba Vi National Park is considered "the green lung" providing fresh air and balancing the ecology of the Western region of Hanoi. Covering more than 11,000ha, it features a cool climate yearround, diverse nature with pristine forests, water streams, and rich history and culture. Ba Vi National Park offers a variety of experiences, from trekking, photography, and relaxation to spiritual pilgrimages. Visiting Ba Vi is not only about escaping the summer heat but also about finding tranquility in the mountains and forests right on the outskirts of Hanoi.

CONOUERING BA VI MOUNTAIN

Located within the boundaries of Ba Vi National Park, the majestic Ba Vi mountain range features three famous peaks: Vua Peak (1,296m), Tan Vien Peak (1,227m), and Ngoc Hoa Peak (1,131m), each holding numerous scenic spots and valuable historical sites. The journey to conquer Ba Vi (combining both driving and hiking) is an adventure through layers of nature, history, and culture - from the refreshness of the forest streams to the timeless marks of French architecture, culminating in the sacred atmosphere at the mountain summit.

MAIN ATTRACTIONS

AT THE FOOT OF THE MOUNTAIN

Ngoc Hoa Stream: About 3-4km from the Cactus Garden, Ngoc Hoa Stream winds through pristine forests, featuring fresh and clear water that provides a relaxing experience.

MID-MOUNTAIN:

This is where several famous check-in spots concentrate, such as:

Ngoc Hoa Cave: A cave formed by geological faulting, featuring large rocks stacked on top of each other, creating a mysterious atmosphere.

Ancient French Church: The ruins of an old church built in European style are nestled within the mountain forest, offering a beautiful and enigmatic landscape.



Abandoned Prison: Once a place for confining political prisoners, the prison is located on a high hill, with steep and isolated paths, so it's important to consider your physical condition before hiking up there.

Bao Thien Tower: A 13-story tower built on the mountainside, where visitors can enjoy panoramic views of Ba Vi.

ON TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN

As the trail climbs higher from the mid-mountain area, it grows steeper and cooler, with a refreshing chill even in summer. Here lie some of Ba Vi Mountains' most sacred religious sites.

President Ho Chi Minh Temple: Built in 1999 at Vua Peak of Ba Vi Mountain (1,296m), this temple is a must-visit for travelers coming to Ba Vi.

Thuong Temple: This temple dedicated to Tan Vien Son Thanh, the sacred mountain deity in folk beliefs. From here, visitors can enjoy a panoramic view of Ba Vi, especially on sunny days.

If you have extra time, consider spending an overnight stay amidst the mountains at one of the luxury resorts located within Ba Vi National Park.

Ba Vi has long been famous for its dairy farms and dairy products. Fresh milk, yogurt, milk cakes, and flan are among the most popular local specialties, loved by visitors for their rich flavor and high nutritional value.

You can buy these specialties at milk shops along Provincial Road 87, from Tan Linh Gas Station (Suoi Hai Commune) to the Lang - Hoa Lac Expressway T-junction (Hoa Lac Commune).



When the sweltering heat of summer gradually recedes, Hanoi dons a new cloak with crystalline blue sky full of white clouds drifting lazily by, golden sunlight, and a gentle breeze known as autumnal cold breeze (gio heo may) beginning to blow.

The allure of a Hanoi autumn is not just in its beauty but also in the delightful flavors of its seasonal fruits. Markets and street corners are vibrant with the colors of ripe produce. You'll find sweet, crispy persimmons sold by vendors on bicycles, and fragrant, soft custard apples that offer a refreshing taste. The round, moon-like pomelos from Dien and Doan Hung are juicy and delicious, a treat that is both tasty and wholesome.

And above all, there is com, the iconic young green rice, wrapped in fragrant lotus leaves. Tender young rice grains are meticulously roasted, pounded, and sifted, transforming into

a chewy, fragrant delicacy. While it is used in many dishes, from pork patties to cakes, the purest way to enjoy it is to simply take a pinch and let the authentic taste of Hanoi's autumn melt in your mouth.

For a truly unique perspective on the city's culture this autumn, consider a journey aboard the "Ha Noi 5 cua o" (Hanoi 5 gates) train, a cultural tourism experience launched by Vietnam Railways (VNR) in September 2025.

The double-decker train features five themed carriages, each named after one of the ancient gates of the Thang Long Citadel: O Cau Den, O Quan Chuong, O Cau Giay, O Cho Dua, and O Dong Mac. Each is uniquely designed to reflect a distinct aspect of Hanoi's old culture. During the trip, passengers can enjoy live performances traditional music such as cheo, xam or quan ho, and are served seasonal snacks and drinks.

EARLY MORNING

6:00AM - 8:00AM: Phan Dinh Phung Street

This street is renowned for its century-old dracontomelon trees. In late autumn, their leaves turn a brilliant yellow and fall to create a golden carpet on the pavement, forming Hanoi's most iconic autumn scene. In the early morning, the low-angled sun filters through the canopy, creating a breathtaking play of light and shadow on the street below.

Founded in the late 11th century, the Temple of Literature and Imperial Academy served as Vietnam's first national university and remains a powerful symbol of the nation's reverence for learning.

The complex's courtyards are home to *bang* trees (Indian almond trees). In autumn, their leaves transition from green to yellow and finally to a deep reddish-brown before falling. The deep reds and golds of the foliage create a stunning contrast against the ancient architecture of red brick courtyards and mossy-tiled roofs, adding to the site's nostalgic atmosphere.


2:00PM - 4:30PM: Around Hoan Kiem Lake

A particular *mo* tree (sterculia foetida) on the banks of Hoan Kiem Lake (along Dinh Tien Hoang Street) is a local celebrity, featured in countless photographs. Its beautiful canopy has two large, sweeping branches that create a perfect natural frame for the distant Turtle Tower. In late autumn, its leaves turn a uniform, brilliant yellow, creating a radiant and dreamlike focal point for the lake.





Nearby, the street corner outside the Nhan Dan Newspaper office (Hang Trong Street) is another beloved spot for capturing the "golden leaf season," thanks to its combination of fallen leaves and French-style walls.



Let a fine autumn day be your invitation to cross the Red River and explore the fertile lands on its opposite bank. Today, modern bridges have made the areas of Gia Lam, Long Bien, Dong Anh, and Me Linh more accessible than ever, just a short drive from the city take a leisurely walk or cycle along the dike, breathe in the fresh air, snap photos, and feel the tranquil rhythm of life in Hanoi's outskirts.

The Co Loa Citadel, about 15km from the center of Hanoi, has always been one of the most ancient and significant historical sites of Vietnam. This was once the capital of the Au Lac state, founded by King An Duong Vuong in the 3rd century BCE. The citadel's genius lies in its unique spiral design, a series of fortified earthen ramparts that coil like a conch shell. Today, visitors can still walk the grounds and see

the earthen traces of the three original ramparts. This is also where Ngo Quyen proclaimed himself king in 939, after his victory over the Nam Han invaders.

Within the inner citadel, echoes of the past are preserved in numerous historical and artistic architectural sites: the Thuong Temple, dedicated to King An Duong Vuong; the Co Loa Communal House, thought to mark the site of the former royal court; a temple honoring

Princess My Chau (Am Ba Chua); and the Bao Son Pagoda with its 134 statues. As a complete complex of Vietnamese spiritual architecture, the Co Loa site was officially recognized as a national historical and cultural relic in 1962.





The nearby National Exhibition Center (also known as Golden Turtle Exhibition Hall) is the Capital's newest architectural landmark and the largest of its kind in Southeast Asia. The design draws inspiration from the sacred history of Co Loa itself, featuring a colossal steel dome that soars over 50 meters high. The center has already captured the public's imagination, drawing over 10 million visitors to its inaugural exhibition, "80 Years of the Journey of Independence - Freedom - Happiness", and has proven itself a premier venue for major cultural events and concerts, accommodating audiences of up to 50,000 people.

Trana POTTERY VILLAGE

On the left bank of the Red River, just around 15km from Hanoi's center, lies Bat Trang, one of Vietnam's oldest and most celebrated pottery villages. Established around the 14th-15th centuries, Bat Trang ceramics are renowned for their distinctive local clay, durable glazes, and exquisite decorative patterns. From elegant ancient blue glazes and contemplative crackled glazes to modern colored varieties, each ceramic piece embodies the spirit of the earth and fire from which it was born. Today, Bat Trang is not only a traditional craft village but also a vibrant cultural destination where visitors can learn its history, experience the craft, and create their own ceramic souvenirs.

Despite the passage of centuries, the historic character of Bat Trang endures in its narrow alleys, moss-covered roofs, and surviving traditional kilns. The village preserves dozens of historic architectural buildings, including the Bat Trang Communal House, ancestral halls, and ancient homes, most notably



is the Van Van ancient house, which displays a collection of antique ceramics that represent the pinnacle of Bat Trang's artistry. For those interested in traditional firing methods, the village's last remaining ancient gourd-shaped kiln (lo bau) is a must-see. Once common in the 20th century, the gourd-shaped kiln is a wood and coalfired kiln that was prized for allowing the precise temperature control needed to produce large, high-quality products.

The story of this unique soup is rooted in Bat Trang's history as a bustling port on the Red River, a meeting point for goods from the highlands and the sea. This unique geography inspired the village's potters - who were also skilled cook - to create canh mang muc. They combined dried bamboo shoots from the mountains with dried squid from the sea, resulting in a soup with a sweet, clear broth, chewy shreds of squid, and the delightful crisp-tender texture of the bamboo shoots, offering a truly unique flavor.

Although Christmas and New Year's Eve are not traditional holidays in Vietnam, the values of reunion, happiness, and joy associated with these celebrations have been embraced by the people of Hanoi, making them an integral part of their culture. Hang Ma Street shines brightly with decorations, while major shopping malls are beautifully adorned, and churches are marked by the iconic presence of Christmas trees. When the New Year arrives, Hanoi becomes even more lively. Countdown parties and street festivals filled with music and fireworks radiate the youthful energy of the millennium-old capital.



CELEBRATING CHRISTMAS IN HANOI

Christianity was introduced to Hanoi in the 17th century, taking root and developing, contributing to the city with a system of large churches that bear strong European architectural influences and host Christian festivals. Today, the Christmas season is one of the most anticipated times in Hanoi, as the chilly atmosphere is complemented by the bright lights that adorn the streets. The heart of this festive season lies in the ancient churches, where visitors and locals gather to experience the sacred and warm beauty of the holiday.

ST. JOSEPH'S CATHEDRAL

This is the most famous destination during the Christmas season. From early December, it is adorned splendidly with a towering Christmas tree, a nativity scene, and vibrant colored lights. On Christmas Eve, thousands of people flock to the square in front of the cathedral to join in the solemn mass and the warm melodies of Christmas. Not only a religious site, St. Joseph's Cathedral also serves as a cultural space where people share joy and send wishes amidst the old streets of Hanoi.





CUA BAC CHURCH

Cua Bac Church was inaugurated in 1930 and is one of the most beautiful churches in Hanoi. It features an Indochinese architectural style, combining the form of a European Renaissance church with Asian elements. The church has welcomed numerous Western heads of state for services and has appeared in many publications as a highlight of Hanoi's tourism.

The An Thai Parish (460 Thuy Khue), St. Marie Church (37 Hai Ba Trung), Ham Long Church (21 Ham Long) - all boast their own unique beauty on Christmas Eve. For those wishing to explore a Christmas night beyond the city center, Ha Hoi Parish Church (Hong Van Commune), which preserves its early 20th-century architecture, and Son Tay Church (Son Tay Wd.) - home to the Archdiocese of Hung Hoa - are well worth a visit.

"INDOOR" TOURISM IN HANOI

Winter arrives, making "indoor" tourism thrive in the capital. Hanoi offers numerous warm and inviting "escape from the cold" spaces, allowing you to explore throughout the winter without running out of options. Luxurious shopping centers, all-night café, brightly lit theaters, and art galleries beckon visitors. And do not miss the museums, which preserve the cultural and historical depth not only of Hanoi but of the entire country, such as: the National Museum of History, which houses treasures from a thousand years; the Vietnam Fine Arts Museum, displaying the masterpieces of Vietnamese art through different historical periods; the Vietnam Museum of Ethnology, which vividly recreates the lives of the 54 ethnic groups across the S-shaped land; and the Vietnam Space Museum uses modern technology to open a journey of space exploration.

Recently opened at the end of 2024, the Vietnam Military History Museum has quickly become one of the most popular tourist destinations in Hanoi. Covering an area of nearly 400,000m², the museum houses over 150,000 artifacts, including national treasures such as the legendary MIG-21 aircraft and the T54B tank number 843. In addition to traditional exhibition halls, the museum incorporates advanced technology such as 3D mapping, 3D films, and interactive screens, providing a vivid experience for visitors.

ART CENTRES & CREATIVE WORKSHOP

"Indoor" tourism is also a way to explore the vibrant and creative contemporary art scene of Hanoi - a member of UNESCO's Creative Cities Network. The art centers here are hubs for exhibitions, installations, contemporary performances, and cultural-artistic exchanges.



The tour, which takes place at the Temple of Literature, is divided into several areas that recreate the educational landscape of Vietnam as it was hundreds of years ago. There is the "Nhap dao" (Entering the Path) area, which symbolizes the journey of knowledge; the "Thanh dat" (Achievement) area, which depicts the journey of scholars from their teenage years of study to their triumphant return after passing exams. The Doctoral Stone Stele Garden is set up with Mapping projection technology to help visitors easily understand the inscriptions on the steles. The Thai Hoc Yard hosts the 3D Mapping Show, where the entire façade of the Nha Tien Duong (Front House) transforms into a giant screen that tells the story of the nation's tradition of valuing education and respecting teachers in an innovative and inspiring way.



The hop-on hop-off double-decker bus will take you through the big roads and streets, while the elevated train provides a new panoramic view of the city. Each journey is a way to touch the vibrant beauty of Hanoi.



XICH LO (Cyclo)

Introduced in Hanoi in the late 1930s, the cyclo has transformed from a common means of transportation for locals into a unique aspect of tourism in the capital. With its unhurried pace and quiet rhythm, the cyclo offers a "green tourism" experience, carrying visitors around Hoan Kiem Lake, through the lively Old Quarter, and past landmarks such as the Hanoi Opera House and Dong Xuan Market. Each turn of the wheel reveals a charming and ancient, yet full-of-life Hanoi.

HOP-ON HOP-OFF

The hop-on hop-off service is a modern and flexible option for exploring Hanoi. The doubledecker buses run on a fixed schedule, passing by over 20 famous attractions such as the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, the Temple of Literature, St. Joseph's Cathedral, the Hanoi Opera House, and Hoan Kiem Lake. Throughout the journey, visitors can enjoy a multilingual audio guide and free Wi-Fi on board. Choose a 24-hour or 48-hour ticket to explore Hanoi at your own pace.

METRO

Clean, fast, and safe, the elevated train serves both as a mode of transportation and as a fresh way to experience the

modern view of Hanoi from above. From the glass windows, the lively streets are revealed with closely packed rooftops, extended rows of trees, and streams of vehicles moving below.

Cat Linh - Ha Dong

This line is 13.1km long and runs entirely above ground. The starting point of the line is at the intersection of Cat Linh and Giang Vo streets, following Hao Nam Street, passing through Hoang Cau Street to Lang Street, then running across the To Lich River, along Nguyen Trai - Tran Phu - Quang Trung streets, and ending at Yen Nghia Bus Station.

Line

Nhon - Hanoi Station

(Currently operating only to Cau Giay)

This line is 12.5km long (8.5km above ground and 4km underground). The starting point of the line is at Nhon Station, traveling along National Highway 32, following Ho Tung Mau Street to cross Beltway 3, and stopping before Thu Le Park. At this point, the line begins to go underground, running along Kim Ma Street, passing through Cat Linh Street, and ending at Hanoi Central Station.
